Adult Foster Care: Provides 24-hour supervision in adult foster homes for people who are unable to live independently in their own homes because of emotional, physical, or mental limitations. Staff live in the household and share a common living area with clients. Services include assistance with personal care, activities of daily living, and transportation coordination. Community Attendant Services: Provides attendant services for adults and children whose chronic health problems cause them to be functionally limited in performing activities of daily living. Personal assistants assist clients with household tasks, meal preparation, arranging and accompanying clients on trips for medical treatment, personal care, and shopping. Call to be screened. If younger than age 60, call DADS intake line; if age 60 or older, call the Area Agency on Aging. Practitioner's statement of medical need required & must receive Medicaid or be determined Medicaid eligible for this service only.

Primary Home Care: Provides assistance with daily needs for adults and children whose health problems limit their ability to perform activities of daily living. Services include household tasks, meal preparation, escorting, personal care, and shopping. Call to be screened.
